DATE: November 21, 2023 SUBJECT: Request for Information (RFI)

# Description

This request for information (RFI) solicits feedback on a draft Transmission System Interconnection Roadmap prepared by the U.S. Department of Energy's Interconnection Innovation e-Xchange (i2X) program. This roadmap covers interconnection solutions for the transmission system/bulk power system only. Feedback from interconnection stakeholders regarding the Roadmap's content (e.g., challenges, solution sets and key actions) will ensure the final version provides a comprehensive set of strategies to improve the interconnection process. Interconnection stakeholders include, but are not limited to, utilities, grid operators, grid reliability organizations, Tribal governments and utilities, Federal and state regulators, state and local governments, clean energy developers, energy justice groups, nonprofits, and trade associations. <u>Read the draft i2X Transmission System Interconnection Roadmap</u>.

### Background

The electric grid is transforming rapidly, with an increasing number of interconnection requests for clean energy resources straining the existing processes and paradigms for grid interconnection. Throughout the United States, queue times to interconnect clean energy projects have been rising, delaying the deployment of new resources to the transmission grid.<sup>1</sup> To address these challenges, the U.S. Department of Energy launched the Interconnection Innovation e-Xchange (i2X) program in June 2022 to enable simpler, faster, and fairer interconnection of clean energy resources while enhancing the reliability, resilience, and security of the electric grid. One of the core activities of i2X is to formulate a practical roadmap for interconnection based on stakeholder input. i2X convened diverse interconnection stakeholders through a series of virtual public meetings that covered key issues, including cost allocation, queue management, data transparency, equity and energy justice, workforce, grid engineering practices, and EV charging. During these meetings, the i2X team facilitated open discussions to identify challenges, knowledge gaps, practical short-term solutions, and potential paradigm-shifting ideas to improve U.S interconnection processes. This roadmap is, in part, informed by these meetings, and is a guide for interconnection innovation for the full range of interconnection stakeholders.

This will also help the U.S. electricity system meet decarbonization goals. The i2X team is especially interested in feedback on the feasibility of implementing these solutions in the proposed timelines and in any important challenges, solutions, or topic areas that are not identified.

- 4. What are the most important solutions and key activities identified in the roadmap? Which solutions and key activities should be prioritized (e.g., short-term, mediumterm)? What, if anything, is missing in the proposed solutions or key actions?
- 5. What potential barriers do you foresee in executing the solutions, and how significant are they?
- 6. Please address whether stakeholders' activities, roles, and challenges are sufficiently represented.
